## Passover Flannel Graph

Take 3-5 minutes at the beginning of the class to present an overview of the life of Moses. Here are the bullet points and the flannel graph items are highlighted yellow.

- 1. Moses had a miraculous birth.
  - a. The Israelites were slaves in Egypt and Pharaoh had ordered all the male babies being born to be killed.
  - b. Instead, Moses's mother placed him in a small ark and placed him in the Nile. (BABY MOSES) Who remembers what happened next?
  - c. This is really one of the greatest miracles of Moses's entire life! Pharaoh had commanded all the Jewish baby boys to be killed, and God placed a Jewish baby boy in Pharaoh's own house to be raised by his daughter!
- 2. Years later, Moses had fled to live in the wilderness.
  - a. One day while he was tending his flocks, his attention was drawn to a burning bush. Amazingly, even though the bush was burning, it was not being consumed.
  - b. (MOSES AT THE BURNING BUSH)
  - c. God spoke to Moses that day and gave him a new job to return to Egypt and lead the Children of Israel out of slavery.
- 3. When Moses returned to Egypt, Pharaoh was not on board with God's plan!
  - a. God then began a series of ten plagues that demonstrated that the One True God was the God of Israel.
  - b. (THERE ARE NINE SMALL PLAGUES TO POST) After nine divine warnings from God, Pharaoh would still not allow the people to leave.
- 4. The 10<sup>th</sup> Plague was the most serious.
  - a. God would send a Death Angel throughout the land and all the firstborn would be killed. This would be the plague that would break Pharaoh.
  - b. God in His mercy gave the Israelites a way to avoid the plague. We refer to is as Passover.
  - c. They were to kill a lamb and eat it, (FAMILY EATING) and then paint the blood on the doorposts of their home (MAN PAINTING). The Death Angel would pass over if he saw the blood.
